



Annual Tree and Plant Sale



Canadian Hemlock - Short, soft light yellow green needles in spring changing to glossy dark green. Likes moist, organic well-drained soils. Tolerates shade well. Does not tolerate drought and wind.



Norway Spruce – A graceful pyramidal with shiny, dark green needles. Beautiful spreading branches with drooping twigs. An extremely hardy tree that grows in most soil conditions. Makes a charming Christmas tree, an appealing ornament specimen, or a protective windbreak. Fast growth makes this spruce ideal for timber.



Balsam Fir- Native to most of eastern and central Canada and the northeastern United States, this is an aromatic, symmetrical, narrow, pyramidal to conical evergreen conifer with a spire-like crown. It typically grows to 50-70' (less frequently to 90') tall and to 15-25' wide. Beautiful Christmas tree, picturesque ornamental.



White Pine – A majestic evergreen, this very hardy pine grows stately and gracefully tall. Needles are soft and bluish green in color, Bark is thin, smooth and greenish-brown, darkening as tree matures. With adequate moisture, growth can be 12" to 18" per year. Ideal for specimen planting, shade, and windbreaks.



Austrian Pine – A medium to large conifer that is native from central and southeastern Europe to western Asia. It grows 40-60' tall over time (less frequently to 100'). Grow in deep, moist, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates some drought once established. Also tolerates clay soils. Generally tolerant of urban conditions.



Emerald Green Arborvitae – A dense, conical to narrow-pyramidal (sometimes maturing to broad-pyramidal), often single-trunked, evergreen tree. 'Emerald Green' is a semi-dwarf cultivar with a compact, narrowly pyramidal habit. Glossy bright green, scale-like foliage in flat sprays. Grows 3-4' wide by 10-12' high in sun to part shade.



Flowering Dogwood- Dogwood is a small deciduous tree that typically grows 15-30' tall with a low-branching, broadly-pyramidal but somewhat flat-topped habit. It arguably may be the most beautiful of the native American flowering trees. Landscape uses are numerous.



American Redbud – A small flat-topped tree, producing pink blooms on bare stems in early spring. Foliage is large and heart shaped, changing to yellow in the fall. Does well in protected location.



Bur Oak –Bur oak or Mossycup oak, is one of the most majestic of the native North American oaks. It is a medium to large deciduous oak of the white oak group that typically grows 60-80' (less frequently to 150') tall with a broad-spreading, rounded crown. Acorn cups are covered with a mossy scale or bur near the rim, hence the common names. Adapts to a wide range of soil conditions



Elderberry – Great for jellies, wines, and brandies. Native to eastern North America. It is a deciduous, somewhat sprawling, suckering shrub that typically grows to 5-12' tall. It typically occurs on streambanks, moist woodlands, thickets, fence rows and roadsides. Grow in medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Tolerates a wide range of soils, but prefers moist, humusy ones. Spreads by root suckers to form colonies.



Red Oak – A medium sized, deciduous tree with a rounded to broad-spreading, often irregular crown and dark, lustrous green leaves. Typically grows at a moderate-to-fast rate to a height and width of 50-75' Easily grown in average, dry to medium moisture, acidic soil in full sun. Prefers fertile, sandy, finely-textured soils with good drainage.



Everbearing Strawberry Plants- Strawberries are one of the easiest fruits for the home gardener to grow and one of the most rewarding. This perennial blooms spring and summer prior to bearing fruit. Will produce large juicy berries throughout the summer. Comes bare-root.



Sugar Maple- This tree is a main component of the Eastern U.S. hardwood forest and is one of the trees which is most responsible for giving New England its reputation for spectacular fall color. Medium green turn yellow-orange in autumn, sometimes with considerable color variations. Easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade. Best in fertile, slightly acidic, moist soils in full sun. Grows poorly in compacted, poorly drained soils. Intolerant of road salt. Generally intolerant of urban pollution.

Asparagus - Unlike most vegetables, asparagus plants are perennial, which means the same plants grow in your garden year after year. The spears that we enjoy as a vegetable are the new shoots that emerge in spring. Delicious steamed or roasted. Comes bare-root.
