



Annual Tree and Plant Sale



Serbian Spruce - A stunning, graceful landscape tree. Beautiful as a single garden specimen or in groupings. Narrow, pyramidal, spire-like tree with pendant branches that ascend at the tips. Flattened bright green needles have silvery undersides. It grows to 50-60' tall by 15-20' wide in full sun to part shade.



'Majestic' Colorado Blue Spruce – A graceful pyramidal conifer with four-sided, distinctly blue needles. Dense, narrow, conical evergreen with stiff horizontal branches. An extremely hardy tree that grows 40-60' tall by 10-20' wide in most soil conditions. Makes an appealing ornament specimen, or a protective windbreak. Slow grower, great Christmas tree.



Douglas Fir- Native to the western United States, this is a symmetrical, narrow, conical evergreen conifer. It typically grows to 40-80' tall and 12-20' wide. Beautiful Christmas tree, picturesque ornamental, great in masses for screening.



White Pine – A majestic evergreen, this very hardy pine grows stately and gracefully tall. Needles are soft and bluish green in color, Bark is thin, smooth and greenish-brown, darkening as tree matures. With adequate moisture, growth can be 12" to 18" per year. Ideal for specimen planting, shade, and windbreaks.



Kousa Dogwood - A small, deciduous flowering tree or multi-stemmed shrub that typically grows 15-30' tall and wide, with a vase-shaped habit in the early years but eventually maturing to a more rounded form. Bloom occurs in late spring in full sun or part shade. Fruit is edible.



Techny Arborvitae – A compact, broad-based, upright, conical to pyramidal shaped often single-trunked, evergreen tree. Green, scale-like foliage in flat sprays that does not yellow in the winter. Grows 6-10' wide by 10-15' high in sun to part shade.



American Redbud – A small flat-topped tree, producing pink blooms on bare stems in early spring. Foliage is large and heart shaped, changing to yellow in the fall. Does well in protected location. Stunning in spring bloom.



Pin Oak – A medium sized deciduous oak of the red oak group that typically grows 50-70' tall by 40-60' wide with a broad pyramidal crown primarily native to the Midwest and mid-Atlantic States. Great street or landscape tree.



River Birch – A vigorous, fast-growing, medium-sized single or multi-stemmed tree with an open habit and gorgeous exfoliating salmon-pink to reddish brown bark showing a lighter inner bark. Native to Eastern US., grows 40-70' tall by 40-60' wide. Great for riverbanks, wet soils and adapts well to clay soils. Beautiful landscape specimen.



Aronia Berry (Black Chokeberry) – Aronia berries are the newest 'superfruit' with high quantities of antioxidants and more polyphenols than blueberries. Native to North America, this shrub does well in full sun or along wooded borders. Berries are a bit astringent so they are often used in pies, jellies, syrups, teas, wines, and brandies



Elderberry – Great for jellies, syrups, pies, wines, and brandies. Native to eastern North America. It is a deciduous, somewhat sprawling, suckering shrub that typically grows to 5-12' tall. It typically occurs on streambanks, moist woodlands, thickets, fence rows and roadsides. Prefers medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade but tolerates a wide range of soils. Spreads by root suckers to form colonies.



Red Maple- A medium-sized, deciduous tree native to Eastern North America that typically grows 40-60' tall by 30-50' wide with a rounded to oval crown. Great shade and specimen tree with red fall color. Not a good street tree due to its shallow roots.



Everbearing Strawberry Plants- Strawberries are one of the easiest fruits for the home gardener to grow and one of the most rewarding. This perennial blooms spring and summer prior to bearing fruit. Will produce large juicy berries throughout the summer. Comes bare-root.



Red Splendor Crabapple – A small flowering crabapple with single pink blooms opening from red buds. Litter is not a problem with this crab, as the small bright red fruit never falls. Excellent food for wildlife. The foliage is glossy reddish-green, turning reddish-purple in fall.



Asparagus - Unlike most vegetables, asparagus plants are perennial, which means the same plants grow in your garden year after year. The spears that we enjoy as a vegetable are the new shoots that emerge in spring. Delicious steamed or roasted. Comes bare-root.



Hazelnut – A large shrub known for its tasty nuts. It will reach dimensions of 15 feet tall and 15 feet wide, becoming arching and spreading with age. Thrives in full sun but tolerates partial shade. Great for dry or wet sites.



Herb Garden – Eight Culinary and Healthful herbs in a decorative petal shaped planter. Includes Basil, Parsley, Chives, Cilantro/Coriander, Lavender, Spearmint, Chamomile, Lemon Balm. All plants organic except Lavender and Spearmint.
