



Balsam Fir - A Native, It is celebrated for its rich green needles, natural conical shape, and fragrance. A slow grower- can reach 45-75' high x 20-25 wide.





White Pine – A majestic evergreen, this very hardy pine grows stately and gracefully tall. Needles are soft and bluish green in color, Bark is thin, smooth and greenish-brown, darkening as tree matures. With adequate moisture, growth can be 12" to 18" per year. Ideal for specimen planting, shade, and windbreaks.





Hazelnut – A large shrub known for its tasty nuts. It will reach dimensions of 15 feet tall and 15 feet wide, becoming arching and spreading with age. Thrives in full sun but tolerates partial shade. Great for dry or wet sites.





Canadian Hemlock - Short, soft light yellow green needles in spring changing to glossy dark green. Likes moist, organic well-drained soils. Tolerates shade well. Does not tolerate drought and wind.





White Spruce – This extremely hardy native evergreen typically grows 60-80' tall by 10-20' wide with a cone-shaped crown. Needles are pungently aromatic when crushed. It is best grown in moist, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates some light shade





Elderberry – Great for jellies, syrups, pies, wines, and brandies. Native to eastern North America. It is a deciduous, somewhat sprawling, suckering shrub that typically grows to 5-12' tall. Prefers medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade but tolerates a wide range of soils. Spreads by root suckers to form colonies.





Douglas Fir- Native to the western United States, this is a symmetrical, narrow, conical evergreen conifer. It typically grows to 40-80' tall and 12-20' wide. Beautiful Christmas tree, picturesque ornamental, great in masses for screening.





American Redbud – A small flat-topped tree, producing pink blooms on bare stems in early spring. Foliage is large and heart shaped, changing to yellow in the fall. Does well in protected location. Stunning in spring bloom.





Flowering Dogwood - A small, deciduous flowering tree that typically grows 15-30' tall and wide, with a low-branching, broadly-pyramidal but somewhat flat-topped habit Bloom occurs in early spring in full sun or part shade
